The Fourth Sunday in Lent

Jesus gives sight to a man who had been blind from birth. (John 9:1-41)

One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see.



In the much loved hymn – *Amazing Grace* – a line is taken from this Sunday's Gospel: *I once was blind, but now I see*. The hymn was written by John Newton in the 18th century. His lyrics recall a wondrous moment of grace experienced in the midst of a storm at sea. This moment inspired Newton to leave his longtime involvement in slave-trading, to become an Anglican minister and hymn writer, and advocate for the abolition of slavery. He died 9 months after the British Parliament abolished the slave trade in 1807.

Amazing Grace will be sung at the 9:30 service this Sunday, March 19.

Food Bag Ministry – *Food Needed*


